

The bluebells are flourishing, unfortunately the brambles have obscured many of them by the beech wood glade. We shall be looking into this. There is a trial area in the wood where the bracken and the bramble has been removed to see if this a feasible option in certain areas of the wood.

The bonfires and tree felling is now suspended to allow the birds to nest in peace.

The scrapes and ditches have been reasonably successful and the Woodland Trust is looking into more ways of alleviating the flooding on local properties. On the plus side it will encourage flora and fauna that flourish in that environment.
