- * the celandine, wood anemones, foxgloves, bluebells and many other plants have put on a wonderful display this year – this is mainly due to the clearing of certain areas allowing them to flourish, although not so many orchids this year

Vandalism in Park Wood

The Old Plough/Hay Rake

The old plough disappeared sometime in May or June. Some will be disappointed as they hoped it could be used as a form of 'sculpture' others will be pleased, but the plough debate is no longer an issue.

Very little **vandalism** so far, but early days the schools have not broken up for the summer . The 'information board' on 'the old walled garden' was semi destroyed and will be mended on the next work day. As stated earlier, the hay rick was 'stolen'.

It is hoped the stains on the trees in the glade can be removed.

The foxgloves have, so far, managed to 'keep their heads'.

WHAT ARE WE DOING IN PARK WOOD?

HOLLY

Many people have been unhappy with the holly clearing in Park Wood. The holly has become rampant since the removal of the laurel, neither is indigenous to the wood. The Woodland Trust (who manage the wood) has advised us to remove one third of the holly, mainly the smaller whips and bushes and to keep the more mature trees, allowing the indigenous species to flourish.

CLEARANCE

To allow plants and smaller shrubs to flourish it is essential they have an element of sun and shade, the bracken, brambles and holly are preventing this from happening.

WALLIS ROAD MEADOW

The clearing of Wallis Road Meadow was done by an army of volunteers over several work days. We hope to encourage more meadow plants and wild life together with the help and guidance of the Woodland Trust.

MAINTENANCE

We shall continue to maintain the paths, although this year has been an uphill struggle with record rain and subsequently record mud!!!! It is not possible for us to completely clear the paths of mud, it is after all a wood, but we will do our best to make the wood a pleasant experience for all – it is a magical place.
